



Primary Sports Premium Funding 2025 – 2026

At Manor Court Community Primary School, we pride ourselves on promoting healthy lifestyles through the taught curriculum, extra-curricular activities, participation in sports festivals and inter and intra-school competitions.

Our school vision is to create a physical education curriculum that motivates, inspires and develops every child's enthusiasm to become a lifelong learner and participator in sport, knowing how to keep fit and healthy. We aim to give opportunities for all pupils to develop their physical, leadership and coaching skills. As a school we want to create a thrill around physical activities, where every child feels confident and ready to participate.

Primary Sports Premium: This financial year the school will receive £19,390 to support and develop the delivery of high-quality PE in school. We have a school development plan that demonstrates how we intend to achieve this. Please see 2025 - 2026 Sports Grant Additional Funding Final Spreadsheet in this document.

How we will use the money effectively: A large proportion of our funding has been spent on staffing costs where adults are used to teach during curriculum and extra curriculum time to inspire and challenge our children in their P.E and sporting endeavours. We aspire to encourage effective CPD where staff learn alongside established sports coaches as they teach our children. We also book staff onto external courses to upskill them in areas where audits have identified need. Additionally, we use money to enable our children to compete in inter-school competitions as part of our School Games involvement.

Sustainability: Our P.E. provision is embedded in the fabric of our school life. We have ensured that we now have systems in place which will ensure that staff are well supported and prepared to deliver high quality lessons that facilitate children's enjoyment and progression in P.E. Competition is an integral part of what we do, we have established strong links with local clubs and a rich variety of after school clubs and curricular P.E. opportunities are available for all children.
