Club Descriptions

Club Name	Description
Homework	Homework club provides an opportunity for the children to complete their homework in a familiar environment with supportive resources, adults, and peers.
Times Tables	Times Table Rockstar Club is an opportunity for children to practice their times tables which have been individually personalised for every child to help improve their speed.
Creative Club	Creative club is an opportunity to collaboratively share ideas, resources, and skills. The children can return to and build on their previous learning, refining ideas and develop their ability to represent their making through creative models with Lego, wooden blocks, arts and craft and various other mixed media.
Craft/ Textiles Club	a time for children to develop their sewing skills which they have been doing in the MC48 as well as a variety of crafts and activities.
Film Club	The children are going to watch a variety of U grading films, followed by a discussion and review after.
Dodgeball	Dodgeball is a team sport in which players on two teams try to throw soft balls and target their opponents, while avoiding being targeted themselves.
Drama Club	Drama club is a lovely opportunity for children to play games and express themselves. We look at lots of different stories and most importantly have lots of fun!

Dance Club	Y2,3 dance club - children will have fun while learning dances to perform at the school's Summer Show. Y4,5 dance club - children will have fun while learning dances to perform at Yeovil's Octagon Theatre in April, and the school's Summer Show.

Nature Club	Nature Club allows your child to explore the outdoors in a way that is educational and enjoyable! Wellies are recommended.
Football	Football is a game where two teams play against each other and try to score goals in the opposite net without using their hands or arms.
Sewing Club	In sewing club, the children are learning and sharing their knowledge of basic sewing skills. The aim is for the children to work on one or two small projects over the term which will give them something to show for their commitment to the club and their newly acquired skills.
Cheerleading	A team sport for boys and girls where children learn stunts, jumps, tumblers, and dance for fast paced routine which will be performed at the summer show.
Netball	We will be learning the basic skills and rules of the game in preparation for matches.
Multicultural Club	In multicultural club we learn about the diverse world we live in. Children will understand celebrations in a variety of countries, traditions, typical outfits, food and many more. They will create artwork related with something traditional in other countries, listening to some key words in different languages and using iPads to explore languages and research about countries.
Debate Club	This club will be a chance for children to develop their oracy skills (speaking and listening), keep up to date with things going on in the world around them and have lots of great discussions.
Tennis Club	Tennis is a racket sport that can be played individually against a single opponent (singles) or between two teams of two players each (doubles)
Lego Club	Lego club encourages children to learn whilst having fun. Creativity, problem solving, and teamwork are some of the skills that playing with Lego can teach.
