Manor Court Jubilee pudding competition on Wednesday 25th May

As part of the national Jubilee celebrations the Royal family have held a national pudding competition to design a pudding for Queen Elizabeth II.

On Wednesday 25th May we are delighted to hold our own pudding competition in which children can design and make their own pudding at home and bring it into school (**please do not use nuts in your pudding**). All puddings will initially be judged by their friends in class, then later in the day the winning entry from each class will be judged by Mr Clode, the school council and a local governor to decide which pudding is fit for the Queen.

Each entry will receive a certificate, the class winner will receive a runner up prize and the overall winner will receive a trophy!

Manor Court Street party on Thursday 26th May

On the Thursday of our Jubilee week, we will be holding a traditional street party similar to that which would have been held at the time of the Queen's coronation in 1953.

In the morning the children will spend time on the KS2 playground playing traditional street games, making Union Flags to decorate the tables, sandwiches, and cakes to be eaten at the street party. In the afternoon (weather permitting) the children will spend time together at long tables on the KS1 playground eating the sandwiches and cakes that they have made in the morning. The children will enjoy each other's company whilst listening to the music from the 70-year reign of Queen Elizabeth II. If the weather does not enable us to eat outside together, we will hold our street party in our school hall.

Kings and Queen Day

On Friday 27th May we will hold a Kings and Queens Day in which children and staff can come to school dressed as a historical King, historical Queen, or a member of the royal family, if your child does not wish to dress up they can come to school in non-school uniform that is red, white or blue. During the day the children will learn about important Kings and Queen's in British history.

Throughout the week the children will learn more about Queen Elizabeth II, her family and important time in her reign as Queen of the United Kingdom and the Commonwealth.
