### End of year review from Mr Talmage



Last year I remember, saying out loud and to myself that I hope that the next year is easier and school is more normal. Sadly, for us all this has not proved to be the case as the pandemic continued to dominate our lives! Having said this, whilst I read on internet blogs, in the newspapers and social media, of schools in different parts of the country struggling, it has been a pleasure to lead a school that has continued to thrive. Our school community is truly remarkable!

The highlights of the school year are too many to name in all, but the Twitter and Facebook pages are alive with many highlights and I take pleasure in looking back on these from time to time.

If I was to name two areas of school as a highlight to share with you, it would be first of all the manner in which all children have approached all aspects of school this year. Remote learning from January was a challenge and we were pleased that our blended approach, through the use of recorded lessons, work packs and zoom sessions was overwhelmingly accepted as the correct approach in the parental survey that we took on our return to school.

Our Year 6 children who leave us today have embodied the spirit in which all children returned to school. They took the 2019 Y6 end of KeyStage 2 assessments in May in test conditions. We were delighted that 79% of the children reached the National Age related expectation in their Reading, Writing and Maths tests which was an increase of 54% from the end of KeyStage 1.

The second personal highlight would be achieving the Gold standard in the EAL Quality mark assessment. Within her day with us the national assessor quickly understood our school and the fact that we strived to do our best for all children and truly cared for each other. It is fantastic validation when people from outside of the school see what we see and feel on a daily basis.

I wish you all a very happy and safe school holidays and am extremely grateful for your support throughout this school year.



### Year 6 Leavers 2021

Today we clapped our Year 6 children as they left the school as Manor Court pupils for the last time. This year group has been on the greatest journey with the school as it has improved from being one of the weakest locally to one of the strongest. They are a credit to themselves, their families and the adults who work with them.

We have once more been unable to invite family members into the school to celebrate with them but have uploaded many wonderful videos to celebrate their conclusion of their primary education to the school website. 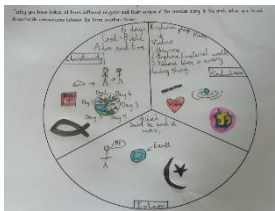
### **Pete the Poet**

## School Uniform

At Manor Court uniform is compulsory for all children as we believe it encourages a sense of pride, loyalty and a sense of belonging. It also avoids discrimination between children and prevents arguments at home about what is suitable to wear to school. All items of clothing should be clearly named. The school cannot accept responsibility for any lost items.

All children from Foundation to Year 6 should choose from:-

- Navy blue V-necked sweatshirt or cardigan with the school logo.
- School ties
- Grey or black trousers/shorts/skirts/skorts. Skirts to be worn at knee length
- White shirt
- Optional blue gingham summer dress
- Black sensible shoes. Trainers are not to be worn to school.

### PE Kit

All children from Foundation to Year 6 should have

- Navy Blue T-shirt with Manor Court logo
- Black shorts and/or jogging bottoms
- Grey tunic, skirt or trousers
- Plimsolls/trainers
- Optional Manor Court PE hoodie



### Jewellery, Hairstyles etc

Children should not wear any jewellery other than one stud earring per ear and a watch. For the safety of the children, they should not wear any jewellery during any PE lessons.

Please ensure that your child has a sensible haircut at all times.

Children are not allowed to wear nail polish or make-up to school unless as part of a celebration day or costume in which case you will be informed in advance.

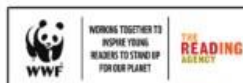
