



Year 3 Curriculum Plan - Spring

English

Writing for a range of purposes through key texts, starting with 'Stone Girl, Bone Girl'.

Grammar taught includes conjunctions, adverbs, paragraphing, subheadings, present perfect tense, inverted commas for speech.

Maths:

Fractions – unit fractions, adding and subtracting.

Shapes – angles and turns.

Money – adding and subtracting.

Compare units of measurement.

Consolidate multiplication and division.

Science:

Rocks, including how fossils are formed and why Mary Anning is a significant person.

Geography:

Extreme Earth – what are volcanoes and how are they formed?

History

Enquiry: Changes in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age.

Key vocabulary

Geography: Volcano, earthquake, mantle, outer core, inner core, crust, tectonic plates, eruptions.

History: stone age, Mesolithic, neolithic, agriculture, evolution, prehistoric

Art and Music

We will be learning about different sketching techniques, experimenting with how to create tone and texture.

Music will focus on Latin dance and exploring and composing salsa rhythms.
